Why transparency?

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"Transparent teaching and learning methods focus on the how and why students are learning course content in particular ways" (Winkelmes 2014).

Impact of transparency

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Transparency helps students

"Transparent teaching/learning methods benefit students who are unfamiliar with college success by explicating learning/teaching processes" (Winklemes 2014).

Impact of transparency

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Transparency results in improved outcomes

A "small" intervention improved student learning by positively impacting academic confidence and sense of belonging and by improving student performance on skills valued by employees (Winkelmes 2014).

A greater benefit was seen for underrepresented and first-generation students (Winkelmes 2014).

Team Task
