Another year has flown by, and the McNair program continues to have great success in providing the personalized and group workshops, seminars, research, and other scholarly experiences that fulfill the McNair grant objectives, and culminate in the student accomplishments highlighted in this program. Mandatory program objectives include student participation in research and scholarly activities, enrollment and persistence in graduate school, and completing the PhD within ten years. In addition to coordinating the McNair summer research internships that are successful because of the dedication of our McNair faculty research mentors, who we will honor today, the McNair program staff provides year-round services to support student success. These services include seminars in scholarly identity and research methods, graduate school application and writing workshops, as well as facilitating conference travel, among many other academic activities.

In our FY 2018-2019, we had 100% of our McNair Scholars accepted into graduate school. Currently, 37 McNair Scholars have earned a Ph.D., and 117 have earned a Master's degree. We have approximately 62 McNair Scholars enrolled in graduate programs, including 21 in Ph.D. programs.

I want to thank the Ronald E. McNair Staff for one more year of excellent collaboration and stimulation of ideas for new projects. I enjoyed working with everyone and hope to continue this positive momentum throughout our summer and next academic year.

I hope you enjoy this program as much as I have enjoyed working with such great individuals this past year.

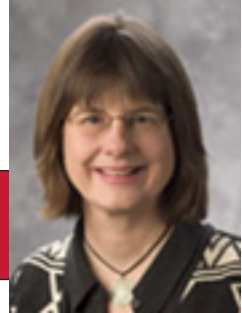

Her two summers of McNair research focused on sex and age differences in the effects of exercise on pain sensitivity. Cheryl is a proud Eagle alum, having graduated from EWU in 2012 with a Bachelor of Science in biology. In 2017, she received her Ph.D. in Molecular, Cellular and Integrative Physiology from the University of California at Davis, where she focused her dissertation on blood gene expression in stroke patients. After graduation, she followed her heart back to Eastern Washington and is now completing her postdoctoral research training in the Krueger sleep lab at Washington State University. Recently, she accepted a position as Assistant Research Professor under the continuing guidance of her WSU postdoc mentor and is currently focusing research interests on the connection between sleep, stroke and the immune system.

“Phylogeny of a new gigantic paravian (Theropoda; Coelurosauria; Maniraptora) from the Upper Cretaceous of James Ross Island, Antarctica”

Highlights

- Imperobator recovered as non-dromaeosaurid (contra Case et al., 2007).
- Phylogenetic analyses (parsimony and Bayesian) suggest possible basal paravian.
- First comprehensive biostratigraphy of latest Cretaceous Antarctic dinosaur faunas.
- Presents first time of occurrence of dinosaur taxa from the Antarctic Peninsula.

Elvin Cabrera is pursuing the professional chemistry degree at Eastern Washington University, and has worked with McNair for two years in preparation to move on to graduate school and earn his PhD. His interests include conducting research in areas such as development of clean and renewable energy, sport supplementation, pharmaceuticals, and health. Cabrera has experience in organic chemistry research extracting essential oils from plant matter and analyzing its chemical composition. Now, working with his mentor Dr. Steiner, his current research involves development of analytical methods for analysis of fatty acid methyl ester (FAME) compounds in biodiesel using gas chromatography with a flame ionization detector (GC-FID) and Fourier transform infrared spectroscopy (FT-IR).

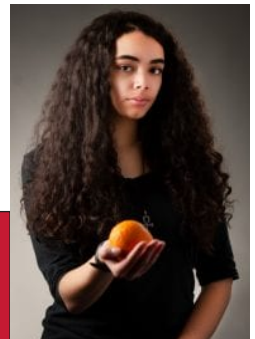
