

TRIO MCNAIR IS AN INVESTMENT IN OUR FUTURE. TRIO MCNAIR CHANGES LIVES!

Eastern Washington University's TRIO McNair the program was first federally funded in 1996, and since then, 30 EWU McNair Scholars have earned their doctoral degrees, an accomplishment that takes years of dedication, and includes only a small percentage of the population. All TRIO McNair scholars come from low-income and first-generation backgrounds, and/or from other groups underrepresented in doctoral programs. Representing, incorporating and respecting these diverse voices – in research, the university classroom, professional arenas and other places – is imperative to our future as a country. TRIO McNair Scholars begin to prepare for success at the doctoral level with research and other scholarly opportunities supported by funding through grants from the U.S. Department of Education. The benefits of TRIO McNair extend far beyond individual doctoral degrees, impacting entire communities through the important work EWU McNair Scholars do throughout their lives.
