ABOUT LAST MILE

Last Mile is a community-funded program designed to support students who are nearing degree completion and facing financial barriers. The program provides students with financial assistance by paying tuition costs and fees when needed. EWU serves a large population of low-income students, and financial insecurity is a primary reason that students leave EWU. The program is designed to be a low-barrier program for students in financial need.

Student Eligibility

- Must be within 30 quarter credits (20 semester) of degree completion
- · Must be an undergraduate student
- · Must indicate financial need

Populations Served

Last Mile is available to any undergraduate student nearing degree completion, regardless of demographics. This program is available for low-income students and students with financial issues.

Accomplishments and Impact

Given that financial insecurity is one of the most significant problems that EWU students face, the Last Mile Fund addresses this issue directly, showing positive results.

- Retention rate for Last Mile recipients, Winter-Spring AY 2024-25: 94%
- Graduation rate for Last Mile recipients, AY 2024–25: 100%
