ARMY ROTC SCHOLARSHIPS

Whether you're a college-bound high school student or already attending a college or university, Army ROTC has scholarships available. Scholarships are awarded based on a student's merit and grades, not financial need.

Army ROTC scholarships consist of:

- Two-, three-, and four-year scholarship options based on the time remaining to complete your degree
- · Full-tuition scholarships
- . The option for room and board in place of tuition, if you should qualify
- · Additional allowances for books and fees

LIVING EXPENSES

Army ROTC scholarships also provide a \$420 per month living allowance for each school year. Nonscholarship Cadets in ROTC advanced courses (3rd and 4th year) also receive this allowance.

If you are applying for an Army ROTC scholarship, you first will need to create a MY GOARMY account.
