Survey Results for Shared Understanding

Rationale

This protocol was developed to help participants from different schools, multiple districts, and multi-level groups synthesize results from a survey into a shared understanding of the terms *college-ready reading* and *college-level reading*.

Time

50 minutes

Materials

- Copies of the survey results and highlighters
- Large chart paper and markers
- Sticker dots (two colors one for high school level and one for college-level)

Procedure

- I. After breaking participants into groups of 4-6, the facilitator distributes survey results and asks participants to read results highlighting words, phrases or sentences that describe college-level reading. (5 minutes)
- 2. Facilitator presents the question:
 - "What is the difference between college-ready reading and college-level reading?"

All write their first thoughts. (5 minutes)

3. The facilitator asks groups to work together to generate categories (4-6 categories) that demonstrate the differences between the two levels of reading. Each group should create a poster of their chart. (15 Minutes)

For example, one category could be the level of independence that is expected in reading a difficult text.

- 4. Each team shares their ideas with the entire group. There is no discussion of the ideas at this time, and posters/charts should be posted on the wall. (5 minutes/team)
- **5.** Facilitator distributes 3-5 sticker dots to each participant and asks them to identify the key categories that demonstrate the differences between college-ready reading and college-level reading.
- 6. The entire group discusses the key categories that are identified and published to provide the cross-level team a shared understanding of the differences between *college-ready reading* and *college-level reading*.
- 7. Debrief the process and its facilitation. 5-10 minutes
