EASTERN WASHINGTON UNIVERSITY'S BACHELOR OF DESIGN IN VISUAL COMMUNICATION DESIGN AND SPOKANE FALLS COMMUNITY COLLEGE'S ASSOCIATE OF APPLIED SCIENCE IN GRAPHIC DESIGN PROGRAM

Articulation Agreement

PURPOSE

This articulation agreement is for students who have earned an AAS/T degree in Graphic Design from Spokane Falls Community College (SFCC) and will complete course work at Eastern Washington University (EWU) to earn a BDes in Visual Communication Design (VCD).

Based on an existing articulation agreement originally established in 2007, this agreement addresses a need to provide students who possess an AAS/T degree in Graphic Design an option for completing a four-year baccalaureate degree. Students with an AAS/T degree in Graphic Design from SFCC would be eligible for enrollment in this program. **With a minimum of 90 credits of upper and lower division coursework, including the Visual Communication Design program and EWU undergraduate requirements,** students may receive a Bachelor of Design in VCD from Eastern Washington University.

The technical content of the Graphic Design program at SFCC has been reviewed previously, is a good match for the program, and the EWU and SFCC faculty are experienced in issues related to advising for student success. **SFCC program faculty will coordinate with EWU faculty to understand EWU General Education and graduation requirements, especially, the 50 credits upper division course work requirement.** With coordinated advising, this agreement meets the needs of SFCC students in an efficient manner. (This is a continuation of an already established agreement; for further information, see previous agreements.)

DURATION

This agreement shall be in force beginning the first day of September 2023. The agreement will be updated as needed/as either SFCC or EWU curriculum changes warrant. See below.

REVIEW

Both SFCC's program in Graphic Design and EWU's program in VCD will designate a minimum of one faculty member per program to oversee articulation currency, accuracy, and efficiency. The appropriate representatives of SFCC and EWU shall review this agreement at the completion of each academic year. Amendments may be required and are allowed to maintain a functional relationship of the articulation agreement.

The articulated agreement will be subject to the following mutually agreed upon stipulations: firstly, if at any time either EWU or SFCC decides to terminate its involvement in this agreement, the appropriate EWU or SFCC departmental representative must provide written notification of this intent at least one year prior to the agreement-ending date (e.g.: written intent to terminate agreement August 30, 2024, provided by terminating institution August 30, 2023). Secondly, SFCC students participating in the articulated agreement will have two years beyond the notice of intent to conclude the SFCC program and make application to Eastern (e.g.: written intent to terminate agreement August 30, 2024, provided by August 30, 2023, giving students until summer 2026 to complete the SFCC program).

Evaluation of courses for transfer credit will not be bound by the terms of this agreement for students who choose to pursue a degree other than the BDes in VCD program. The transferability of courses will be determined on a course-by-course basis if the student does not earn an AAS/T in Graphic Design as indicated in this agreement or does not continue at EWU in the BDes in VCD program.

ARTICULATION AGREEMENT - MAJOR (VCD) REQUIREMENTS

BDes in VCD

Students pursuing the BDes in VCD degree, who have completed the AAS/T in Graphic Design degree at SFCC, will need to take, as a minimum*, the following DESN credits to complete the BDes in VCD major at EWU:

DESN 338 User Experience Design 1 (5 credits)
DESN 325 Emergent Design (5 credits)
or DESN 326 Intro to Animation (5)
or DESN 350 Digital Photography (5)
or DESN 355 Motion Design (5)
DESN 359 Global Histories of Design (5 credits)
DESN 463 Visual Communication Design 3 (5 credits)
DESN 480 Professional Practice (5 credits)
DESN 490 Senior Capstone (5 credits)
DESN electives (20 credits)

*NOTE: The above 50 credits are a minimum. Students must take enough EWU credits to satisfy 180 total credits and 50 upper division credits (300- and 400-level courses) to graduate (see 2-year plan on page 5). Students must also satisfy EWU requirements. See below.

ARTICULATION AGREEMENT - UNIVERSITY (EWU) REQUIREMENTS

General Education Requirements

This program requires an average of 15 credits per quarter to graduate in 2 years. This is based on the following assumptions, students will have satisfied university competencies and proficiencies (see university competencies and proficiencies in the current catalog) prior to enrolling at EWU. If these assumptions are not true, then students will have to complete at least 10 more credits of classes (ENGL 201 and MATH 107 or equivalent) for university proficiencies.

Students will also need to satisfy Breadth Area Core Requirements (BACR) (24-30 credits) and Global Studies (4-5 credits). DESN 359 Global Histories of Design satisfies the EWU Diversity requirement. Some of these classes may be satisfied by coursework at SFCC (i.e., ART&100, PHIL&101, and SOC& 101, see EWU Transfer Guides for additional equivalent courses). Senior Capstone requirements are fulfilled by the major requirements (DESN 490).

Undergraduate Degree Requirements

180 minimum credits, 50 credits must be upper division (300-400 level) and a minimum 45 credits must be taken at EWU. The AAS/T in Graphic Design will satisfy 90 of the required 180 credits. Students who have successfully completed their AAS/T in Graphic Design at SFCC and are accepted to EWU, will enter EWU with 90 credits toward degree completion, upon receipt of final transcripts from SFCC.
