Statement on Addressing Financial, Academic, and Institutional Challenges

This includes integrating strategic planning and multi-year financial modeling with enrollment trends, state funding forecasts, and academic priorities to ensure that institutional resources are aligned with EWU's long-term sustainability and academic excellence.

For students, I would prioritize access and affordability by strengthening cost-containment measures, enhancing financial aid optimization, and leveraging auxiliary services to support the student experience. I would also promote initiatives that increase financial transparency and literacy, recognizing the critical role that economic stability plays in student persistence and completion.

For faculty and staff, I believe that institutional effectiveness depends on cultivating a supportive infrastructure that enables excellence in teaching, scholarship, and service. My leadership would focus on optimizing administrative processes, maintaining compliance with regulatory standards, and directing capital investments to advance instructional and research capabilities.
