## **Annual Theater for Young Audiences Production Series, SFCC, 2018 - 2023**

Initiated and developed a partnership with Spokane Public Schools' T-2-4 Program, facilitating annual field trips for over a thousand elementary students to SFCC. This involved coordinating the use of the larger performance space in the music building, organizing school visits, and planning engaging campus tours to enhance the students' experience. I also created curriculum packets for each production to enrich educational outcomes. Collaboration with campus security,

Associated Student Government, and other stakeholders was essential to ensure a safe and impactful experience for visiting groups while minimizing disruption to college activities.

## Biennial Musical Theater Production Series, SFCC, 2018 - 2023

Initiated and developed an interdivisional collaboration between the Humanities Division and the Visual and Performing Arts Division. This collaboration included establishing shared use of the performance space in the music building, writing a new course in musical theater voice, and working closely with music faculty. Additionally, I secured extra annual funding from the Associated Student Government and established an inclusive show selection process, enhancing the program's reach and diversity.

# Capital Project – Theater Renovation, SFCC, 2018 & 2020

Initiated and led two theater renovation projects in collaboration with the Community Colleges of Spokane Capital Projects Team, architects, and construction companies. These renovations included the installation and replacement of an ADA lift, an over-stage automated rigging system, audience seating, overhead and exit lighting, ADA seating, and new carpeting, enhancing accessibility and functionality for the theater.

### Kīkaha Ka Manu: A Festival Celebrating 'Ōlelo Hawai'i, Leeward CC, 2017

Curated a multidisciplinary exhibit that showcased photography by two local artists, featured a reading of the winning play from our interdivisional 'Ōlelo Hawai'i (Hawaiian Language) play competition, and included an interactive poi-making demonstration led by a local culinary artist. This festival celebrated the richness of Hawaiian language and culture through diverse artistic expressions.

## Plantation Plays, Leeward CC, 2016 - 2017
